- **PLEASE do not dig on gas lines which are still in the ground



DIRECTORIES

Professional excavators, utility companies, and other mechanized equipment must call 811 within 10 feet of any underground utility before digging. Calling 811 even if you plan to dig only a few inches deep will help prevent damage to underground utilities and/or expense.

Call the Georgia 811 Center before you dig. The service is free of charge. Call at least 48 hours before you dig, more than 10 working days, excluding weekends and legal holidays, before starting any digging project. Calling 811 starts the process of locating underground utilities. This process is called "Third Party" refers to those other than the pipeline operator. Please report any suspected signs of damage to a pipeline. If you suspect a natural gas pipeline, please immediately notify us even if the damage seems to be minor, such as a scratch or a small hole.

Watch for signs of damage to underground utilities. Please watch for signs of damage to underground utilities where natural gas pipelines are located.





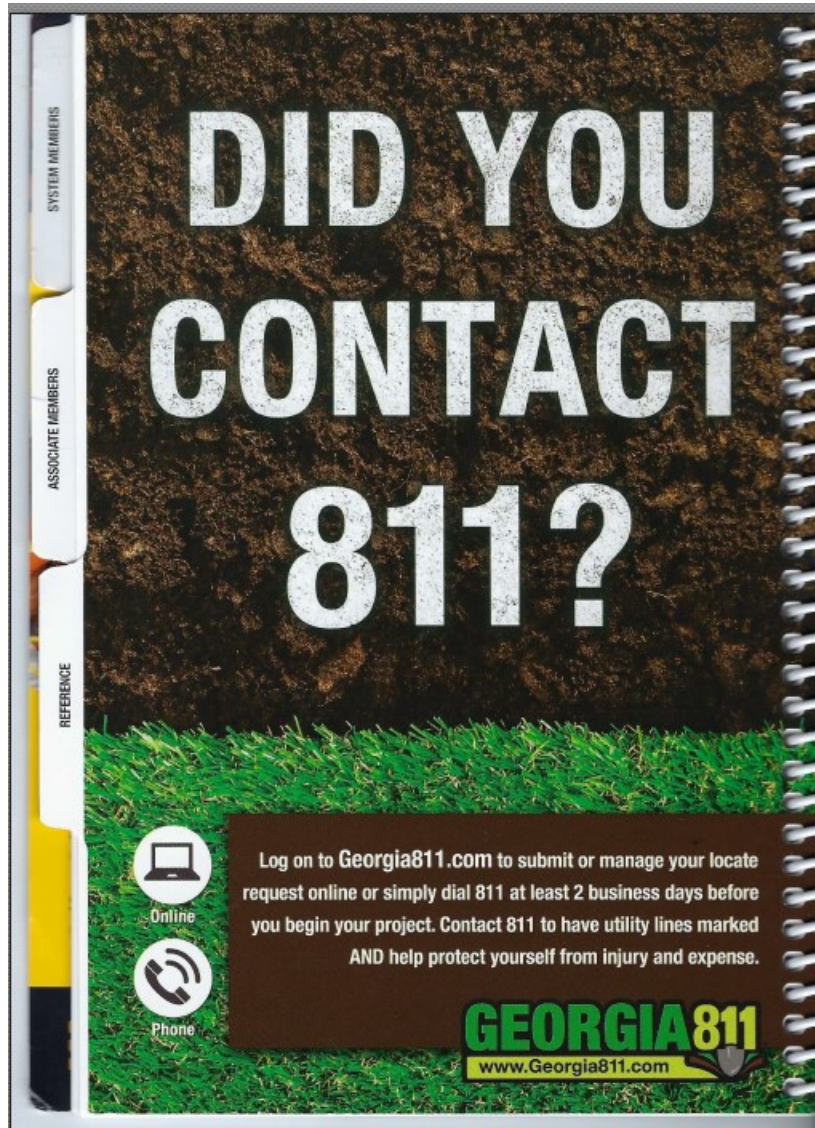

Safe digging starts by contacting Georgia 811. Dial 811 or apply online at myGA811.com, so that we are able to notify our member utilities about your project. The utility companies will send a locate technician to mark their underground utility lines with colored flags and/or paint markings. The number to call is 811 or 1-800-282-7411 statewide. To apply online go to www.Georgia811.com and click the myGA811.com button or go directly to myGA811.com.



A Safe Digging Tribute *by C. Allen Scott*

A Letter to the Editor

In 1992, the highway contractors of the State of Georgia and the telecommunications industry were not getting along. That's a mild description of a major conflict. Highway contractors were accusing the telecommunications industry of flippanantly impeding critical highway construction projects. The telecommunications industry was retorting that highway contractors were showing blatant disregard for the heavy copper cables that connected Georgians to Georgians, and Georgians to the rest of the world. Optical fiber cables, present but in their infancy, were falling prey to bulldozers and backhoes as well. The conflict reached a fever pitch, and the Georgia Department of Transportation intervened. A meeting was called in Macon, the geographic center of Georgia, where representatives from the warring factions were forced to sit down, look each other in the eye, and say the same things face to face that were being said behind the back. My employer, C. W. Matthews Contracting Company, Inc., appointed me to represent our industry.

By 10:00 am, Ms. Campbell had taken the floor at the meeting and spoken enough to instill confidence in me in her wisdom and experience. She represented neither industry. She represented the voice of reason. She argued that neither the highway contracting industry nor the telecommunications industry could survive without access to the public rights-of-way. If we wanted to thrive financially, we had to try and coordinate our operations. The masculine pride that filled the room was reluctant to concede it, but eventually we had to. The lone woman in the room was right.

She was the first person that I ever heard put the two words damage and prevention together. She was passionate about it, and I found her passion to be contagious. She was Claudette Campbell—the young woman that left a lucrative career with Southern Bell (now AT&T-Distribution) to start the Georgia One Call Center. She left Southern Bell in 1980 and never looked back.

Thanks to Claudette:

1. The State of Georgia now has one of the better laws in the nation to define, encourage, and enforce damage prevention—the Georgia Utility Facilities Protection Act (GUFPA).
2. Georgia 811 is now truly a one call center. When I first started in utility coordination, the first challenge of a new project was discovering all of the peculiar rules and regulations for the marking of facilities. "To each his own" was the mantra of facility marking in Georgia until Claudette Campbell led

the charge to rewrite the faulty legislation that preceded GUFPA. Now, with few exceptions, Georgia is truly a one-call state.

3. Diverse industries now work together towards damage prevention and daily production. Ms. Campbell knew that building roads while maintaining utility infrastructures is hard enough when differing industries work together; it is even more so when the differing industries are spitting at each other. She did more to bring us together than anyone I have known in my 42 year career.

If you do the math, 1980 is as good as forty years ago. Forty years is basically the span of a career, and technically, Ms. Campbell's career ended this past April 1 when she stepped down as CEO of Georgia 811 and turned her underappreciated work of damage prevention over to the next generation. I say underappreciated, because Ms. Campbell was not one to "toot her own horn." She was always one to work behind the scenes and deflect the accolades that came her way to her colleagues. Few people actually know what Ms. Campbell did to protect the utility infrastructure while advocating that excavators have to produce to survive.

I happen to be one of the privileged few excavators, and I would be remiss if I did not call attention to the fact that in 2019, Georgia is a safe place to build highways because of Claudette Campbell. Ms. Campbell might not report for work on April 2, 2019, but for anyone who ever worked a day of utility coordination in Georgia, she will always be remembered as The Champion of Damage Prevention. The "Godmother" of Damage Prevention

The name Claudette Campbell is as synonymous with Southern Belle as it is Damage Prevention. Dubbed the "Godmother of Damage Prevention" by Don Heyer, PR Manager with USA North, Claudette lives and breathes damage prevention. Claudette is a woman who walks the walk. Kathy Fournier, Emeritus CEO, Miss Dig, said, "She lives with one philosophy and everyone around her knows her beliefs."

Ask anyone in the industry and it seems they've known Claudette for as long as they have been involved. Most people met her through groups that have evolved over the years but continue today. Have you heard of the SOCS (Southeastern One Call Systems) Group? How about UPC before it became Georgia 811? Or, National Dig Safety Team before it was Common Ground Alliance? Maybe NJUNS, the National Joint Utilities Notification System, a project for overhead utilities which is still operating today? Claudette, at one time or another, has been involved with all of them, earning her recognition as an "early national damage prevention innovator."

If you've met her, you've learned to never underestimate her. Described as irrepressible by Stephen Rieben, Senior Vice President One Call Operations with PelicanCorp, "... she has never been one to keep her opinions to herself and once she's got it in her mind that something needed to be done or, more often, done differently, look out! All you could do is stand back and get out of her way. She might have employed the mannerisms of a Southern Belle to persuade and promote her objectives but her focus and determination ensured that, one way or another, she would win out!"

- Creator of the International Locate Rodeo

- Helping Georgia grow from a working board to a governing board
- Influencing Georgia dig law
- Linking team member of the original USDOT Common Ground Study

- Georgia Utility Contractors Association (GUCA) Lifetime Achievement Award
- Establishing the Utilities Protection Center (UPC) as a separate entity from Southern Central Bell Company
- Changing Georgia Damage Prevention Law requiring all utilities to become a member of UPC
- Mentoring the next generation, not only in Georgia, but nationally
- First recipient of the CGA Hall of Fame Award

Claudette recognizes the mission of damage prevention has no boundaries. With a passion to educate, Claudette realized early she needed to promote damage prevention and safe excavation through any format she could find – media, handouts, legislation, education, etc. Parti Lama, CGA Board and Education Committee Member, compliments Claudette as being her strongest mentor. 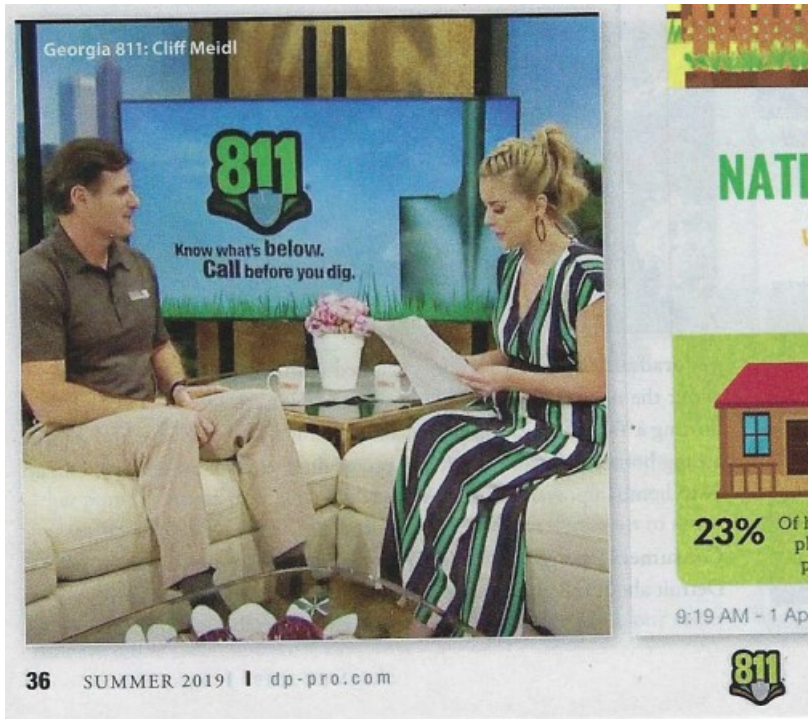

A hero to her peers, Estes said, "Congratulations, Ann! Thank you for being a guiding light in this industry and continuing to inspire me personally and professionally."

A hero to her team, Morehouse said, "NC 811 cannot tell you enough how much we all appreciate the hard work you give to our organization and community."

(BPT) - With spring having officially begun, many eager homeowners and landscape professionals across the country will roll up their sleeves and reach for their shovels to start projects that require digging this season.

During the transition into "digging season," [Common Ground Alliance \(CGA\)](#), the organization dedicated to protecting underground utility lines, people who dig near them and their communities, reminds homeowners and professional diggers that calling 811 is the first step toward protecting you and your community from the risk of unintentionally damaging an underground line.

Every digging project, no matter how large or small, warrants a free call to 811. Installing a mailbox or fence, building a deck and landscaping are all examples of digging projects that should only begin a few days after making a call to 811. Calling this number connects you to your local one call utility notification center.

According to data collected by CGA in a survey in March, millions of American homeowners will likely do DIY projects involving digging this year, but 42 percent of them do not plan to make a free call to 811 before digging.

"Tens of millions of Americans plan to do DIY digging projects this year, but according to our survey, 42 percent of them admit that they will not call 811 beforehand, which puts homeowners and their communities at risk," said CGA President and CEO Sarah Magruder Lyle. "Calling 811 a few days before any planned home improvement projects that require digging — including common landscaping projects like planting trees and shrubs — is critical to preventing incidents like service outages and serious injuries."

CGA's partnership with leading home improvement retailer Lowe's will provide a helpful reminder to the millions of Americans who shop at their stores for projects involving digging.

"During National Safe Digging Month in April and all year round, Lowe's supports 811 by including safe digging information on certain products we sell nationwide — like trees and Kobalt shovels and spades, among others — to help ensure the safety of our Pro and DIY customers who will be outside digging," said Bill Boltz, Lowe's executive vice president of merchandising. "Our customers rely on Lowe's for help completing home and yard improvement projects, and we're committed to providing the critical safety information to help them do it the right way."

A utility line is damaged every few minutes in America because someone decided to dig without making a call to 811 to learn the approximate location of buried utilities in their area. Unintentionally striking one of these lines can result in inconvenient outages for entire neighborhoods, serious harm to yourself or your neighbors, and significant repair costs.

Alto promotes 'Safe Digging Month'

The Alto Town Council, on March 12, approved a resolution proclaiming April as National Safe Digging Month.

In 2005, the Federal Communications Commission designated 811 to provide contractors and homeowners a simple number to contact utility operators to request the location of underground lines at the intended dig site.

The Georgia 811 Utility Coordinating Committee, a stakeholder-driven organization dedicated to the prevention of damage to underground utilities in Georgia, promotes the National 811 Notification System in an effort to reduce these damages.

The council also approved the adoption of a fingerprinting ordinance as to the issuance of a town license or permit, providing for fingerprinting procedures;

to provide when access is authorized and usage regulations; to provide for administration of fingerprinting including fees and other procedures.

The council discussed the proposed ServLine insurance proposal for water customers.

The council agreed to seek additional information from water customers before taking any action on this issue.

An announcement was

made about the town's Annual Clean-Up Day set for 9 a.m. on Saturday, April 27.

The event will take place at the old city hall building.

The town's Annual Spring Fling will be held from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturday, June 1, at the old city hall building.

Board of commissioners receives plan updates

As part of Tuesday's regular meeting of the Cherokee County Board of Commissioners, the board was presented with the latest updates on development plans in various parts of the county, including the Southwest Cherokee Area Plan and concepts for a recreation center at Veterans Park.

A representative from the development firm Lyman Davidson Dooley explained to the commissioners that, after receiving a great deal of community input, concept plans had been drawn up for the proposed rec center. These plans suggested constructing the facility in three stages, but the designs did not leave the earlier portions of the center looking like an unfinished building while the remaining phases were under construction.

The first portion of the center would focus on a gymnasium, a fitness area, an aerobics studio, a community room, office space and locker rooms.

The second phase would add a second gymnasium and additional space in the fitness area, while the final stage would include an indoor lap pool and a leisure pool. The entire structure would have a modernized barn-like appearance, helping it more effectively fit in with the coun-

tryside. The developer said there was not a lot of site work needed, and estimated it would take just over a year to complete the first phase of construction once it began.

Now that a handful of community input meetings have been held on the matter, the county has been working to develop an effective plan for the southwest portion of the county. According to the presentation given at the meeting, the southwest corner of Cherokee County is running out of land, and one of the biggest risks in the area is using up all of the land zoned for lower density residential.

The commissioners were told that the Southwest Cherokee Area Plan was now being worked on and should be ready in the near future. The immediate issues facing the area plan were dealing with the Ga. Highway 92 overlay, as well as revising the future development map, while refining other plans and formulating a marketing plan were concerns to be tackled in the near future.

"I'm very happy with it," Commissioner Corey Ragsdale said.

Cherokee County Fire and Emergency Services Chief Tim Prather gave his annual report to the board. In 2018, the department received an ISO rating of 2/2, which

puts them in the top 3% of all fire departments in the United States, while also receiving the Region 1 EMS Service of the Year award and being recognized as the first fire department in Georgia to heavily support the 811 Call Before You Dig service. Reviewing the statistics for 2018, Prather said there had been a 7% reduction in fire calls, yet a 3% increase in EMS calls. He was happy to say the department had been coming in under budget the past few years, and informed the commissioners he would have the department's latest strategic plan ready soon. After his report, the commissioners had nothing but good things to say about the department.

"We love to brag on our fire department," board Chairman Harry Johnston said. "Thank you for being a braggable fire department."

At the meeting, a public hearing was conducted regarding proposed changes to the recently approved farm winery ordinance. The changes slightly modified some of the language in the law, clarifying provisions on permitting and uses for a farm winery operation. Nobody spoke out against the changes, while one resi-

dent spoke in favor, showing support for the commissioners narrowing the definitions in the law. Following the public hearing, the board approved a motion to make the changes.

The board of commissioners took a few moments during both the work session and the regular business meeting to recognize some outstanding achievement among county employees and local citizens. During the work session, Cherokee Marshal's Office Chief Marshal Ron Hunton presented three of his officers with the rank of Deputy Marshal First Class, while eight young men from Boy Scout Troop 316 were recognized by the commissioners for attaining the rank of Eagle Scout.

The Cherokee County Board of Commissioners also handled the following items:

- Minutes from the May 7 meeting were approved.

- The commissioners approved the sale of excess right-of-way land along Wade Green Road to 92 Wade Green LLC for \$24,400, along with surplus property off of the Hunt Road Connector to Wintergreen Development LLC for \$26,200.

- The board approved the purchase of 100 servers for the county's computerized data storage system from Dell Marketing, L.P. for the

initial price of \$558,854.81, with renewal options of up to five years at an annual cost of \$67,486.92. It was announced that this total was a 64-percent discount from the standard price of the equipment.

- A purchase of self-contained breathing apparatus units and air cylinders for the Cherokee County Fire and Emergency Services Department from Fisher Scientific, not to exceed \$133,424.20, was approved.

- Commissioner Benny Carter appointed Lisa Tressler to the county planning commission for the remainder of a term expiring on Dec. 31, 2020, effective immediately.

- The consent agenda, which included scheduling a public hearing on the Southwest Cherokee Area Plan, accepting a pair of supplemental grant awards for the DUI/drug court and approving a budget amendment to reflect these items and approving a proposal from ARCADIS to add curbs and storm drainage to the east side of the Trickum Road; Sycamore Lane to Belles Lane Improvement Project, was approved.

The next meeting of the Cherokee County Board of Commissioners will be held on Tuesday, June 4. The meeting will begin with a work session at 3 p.m., followed by the regular business meeting at 6 p.m.

Know what's below - Call 811 before you begin digging projects this spring

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During the transition into "digging season," Common Ground Alliance (CGA), the organization dedicated to protecting underground utility lines, people who dig near them and their communities, reminds homeowners and professional diggers that calling 811 is the first step toward protecting you and your community from the risk of unintentionally damaging an underground line.

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According to data collected by CGA in a survey in March, millions of American homeowners will likely do DIY projects involving digging this year, but 42 percent of them do not plan to make a free call to 811 before digging.

"Tens of millions of Americans plan to do DIY digging projects this year, but according to our survey, 42 percent of them admit that they will not call 811 beforehand, which puts homeowners and their communities at risk," said CGA President and CEO Sarah Magruder Lyle. "Calling 811 a few days before any planned home improvement projects that require digging - including common landscaping projects like planting trees and shrubs - is critical to prevent-

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A utility line is damaged every few minutes in America because someone decided to dig without making a call to 811 to learn the approximate location of buried utilities in their area. Unintentionally striking one of these lines can result in inconvenient outages for entire neighborhoods, serious harm to yourself or your neighbors, and significant repair costs.

As a result, CGA offers the following tips to make sure you complete your project safely and without any utility service interruptions, so you don't become a statistic.

Here's how the 811 process works:

1. One free, simple phone call to 811 makes it easy for your local one call center to notify appropriate utility companies of your intent to dig. Call a few days prior to

digging to ensure enough time for the approximate location of utility lines to be marked with flags or paint.

2. When you call 811, a representative from your local one call center will ask for the location and description of your digging project.

3. Your local one call center will notify affected utility companies, which will then send professional locators to the proposed dig site to mark the approximate location of your lines.

4. Only once all lines have been accurately marked, carefully dig around the marked areas.

There are nearly 20 million miles of underground utility lines in the United States, which equates to more than a football field's length of utilities for every person in the U.S. Your family depends on this buried infrastructure for your everyday needs, including electric, natural gas, water and sewer, cable TV, high-speed Internet and landline telephone. With that much critical infrastructure underground, it's important to know what's below and call 811 before digging.

The Georgia Public Service Commission's Regulatory Utility Commission (RUC) has announced that April is National Dig Safe Month. The RUC requires anyone who plans to excavate where underground utilities are located to call 8-1-1 before they dig. The process is simple and can prevent major damage that can endanger and inconvenience our communities and cause economic disruption. Damage from excavation activities to gas and water pipelines, along with sewer systems and buried distribution power lines, results in significant economic loss.

The RUC's Dig Safe Month program is free of charge. Call at least 48 hours before more than 10 working days, excluding weekends and legal holidays, before starting any digging project. Calling 811 starts the process of locating underground utilities. The RUC's Dig Safe Month program is the greatest cause of damage to underground gas pipelines is caused by excavators. Third Party refers to those other than the pipeline operator. Please report any suspected signs of damage to a pipeline. If you suspect a natural gas pipeline, please immediately notify us even if the damage seems to be minor, such as a scratch or dent.

Everyone. Please watch for signs of damage where natural gas pipelines are located.

The Georgia Public Service Commission joined with the Governor Nathan Deal to announce that April is National Dig Safe Month. The RUC requires anyone who plans to excavate where underground utilities are located to call 8-1-1 before they dig. The process is simple and can prevent major damage that can endanger and inconvenience our communities and cause economic disruption. Damage from excavation activities to gas and water pipelines, along with sewer systems and buried distribution power lines, results in significant economic loss.

Using these programs, the Commission provides training and education for excavators and utilities in order to avoid accidents that can cause expensive and often dangerous damage to buried utilities. The Commission also works closely with the RUC, which accepts calls from the national emergency number 8-1-1. This "8-1-1" system is free to contractors and excavators as well as homeowners and helps all excavators comply with the law.

Commissioner Lauren "Bubba" McDonald said, "I want to remind anyone who excavates to call before you dig by placing a call to 8-1-1. It's free and it's the law. A simple phone call can prevent the disruptions and economic losses that can occur when underground utilities are damaged."

The Georgia Public Service Commission is charged with the enforcement of the state's underground utility damage prevention laws.

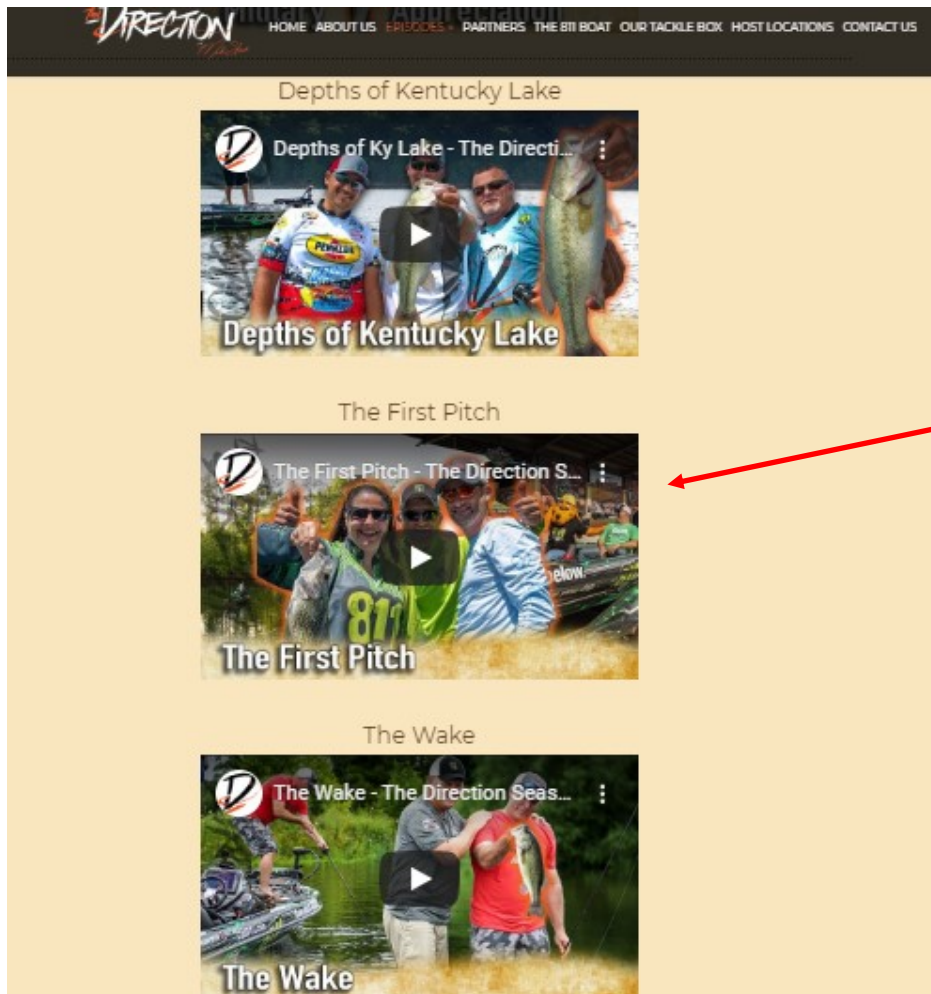

ALBANY, GA (WALB) - April is safe digging month and whether the project is large or small you need to call 811 before you dig.



"Anybody that does any digging needs to call 811," said Brad Winborne with the city of Albany.

Experts say no matter the size of the digging project, calling 811 can save you a headache and prevent the loss of utility service in your neighborhood.

This goes for homeowners and professionals.

"You have to contact at least two business days prior to your project beginning just to give the utilities enough time to respond," said Megan Estes with Georgia 811.

The campaign encourages you to call that number before you dig a hole in your yard to find out if there are underground utility lines where you want to dig. Those companies will send experts to your home and help you find the spots where a line may be buried.

They will look over the land for free and check for any water, gas, or sewer pipes, telecommunications or power lines and let you know if it is okay to dig.

They will locate those underground lines with paint or flags and let the utility companies know that you plan to start digging.

“The system is free- GA 811, the service, the call - everything is free so we do additionally recommend that contact for hand digging. There’s really no reason not to do it because you can also experience damages and injury just with hand tools,” said Estes.

“Main thing is bodily injury is one of the most important things but also it protects whatever utilities that are in the ground from having any interruptions,” said Winborne.

So remember, before you do any digging you will want to call 811 or you can also make the [request online](#) or through their new app on your phone.

No matter the size of the job, Georgia 811 representatives will mark where utility lines are located.

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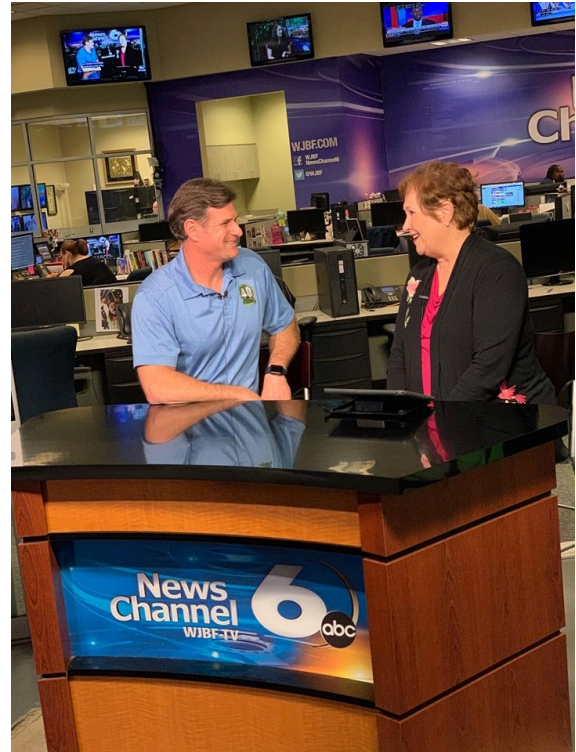

Natural gas is a colorless, odorless gas; however, a chemical that smells like rotten eggs is added to help detect a possible leak. Some of the signs of a gas leak include seeing bubbling water, hearing a hissing or blowing sound from a pipeline or appliance, dead or discolored vegetation in an otherwise green area, or dirt or dust blowing from the ground, or the smell of rotten eggs.

If you smell gas, or just think you might have a gas leak, **leave** the area immediately and call **City of Sugar Hill** at **770-271-2137** or **911** from a neighboring home or business. **Never** turn on or off switches, open or close garage doors, use a flashlight or phone/cellphone in the presence of the gas smell, as these devices may be a source of ignition, causing an explosion.

Call before you dig! When you plan to dig or move dirt with mechanical equipment, call **811** at least 48 hours before you dig. Your call to **811** will be directed to the local One Call Center who will then contact affected utilities to have the facilities in your area marked.

Failure to use **811** is a known cause of pipeline accidents. Calling before you dig is the law and can prevent a costly or even a deadly mistake. Striking an underground pipeline may result in fire, explosion and/or asphyxiation.

Here are some simple steps to damage prevention:

- ✓ **Survey and Mark** – Survey proposed excavation areas and mark the dig sites in white paint
- ✓ **Call Before You Dig** – 48 hours prior to digging, call **811** to have underground facilities located. It is the law in Georgia.

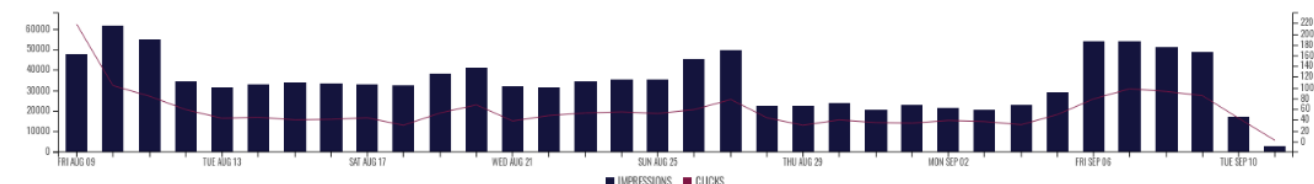

Georgia 811 reminds local residents to call 811 before all digging projects

[Duluth, GA] (April 29, 2019) — Today Georgia Gov. Brian Kemp issued a proclamation announcing April as Georgia Safe Digging Month. The proclamation reminds Georgia homeowners to call 811 before starting any outdoor digging projects.

April marks the start of spring digging season, so Georgia 811 and Gov. Kemp are encouraging homeowners to call 811 before they dig to prevent injuries, property damage and inconvenient outages. Every nine minutes an underground utility line is damaged because someone decided to dig without first calling 811.

When calling 811, homeowners are connected to Georgia 811, which notifies the appropriate utility companies of the intent to dig. Professional locators are then sent to the requested digging site to mark the approximate locations of underground lines with flags or spray paint. Once lines have been accurately marked, digging can begin around marked lines.

"We join the governor in strongly encouraging individuals and companies to call 811 before they begin digging," said Meghan Wade, Georgia 811's President & CEO. "By having underground lines marked, homeowners are making an important decision that can help keep them and their communities safe and connected."

Striking a single line can cause injury, repair costs, fines and inconvenient outages. Every digging project, no matter how large or small, necessitates a call to 811. Installing a mailbox, putting in a fence, building a deck and laying a patio are all examples of digging projects that need a call to 811 before starting.

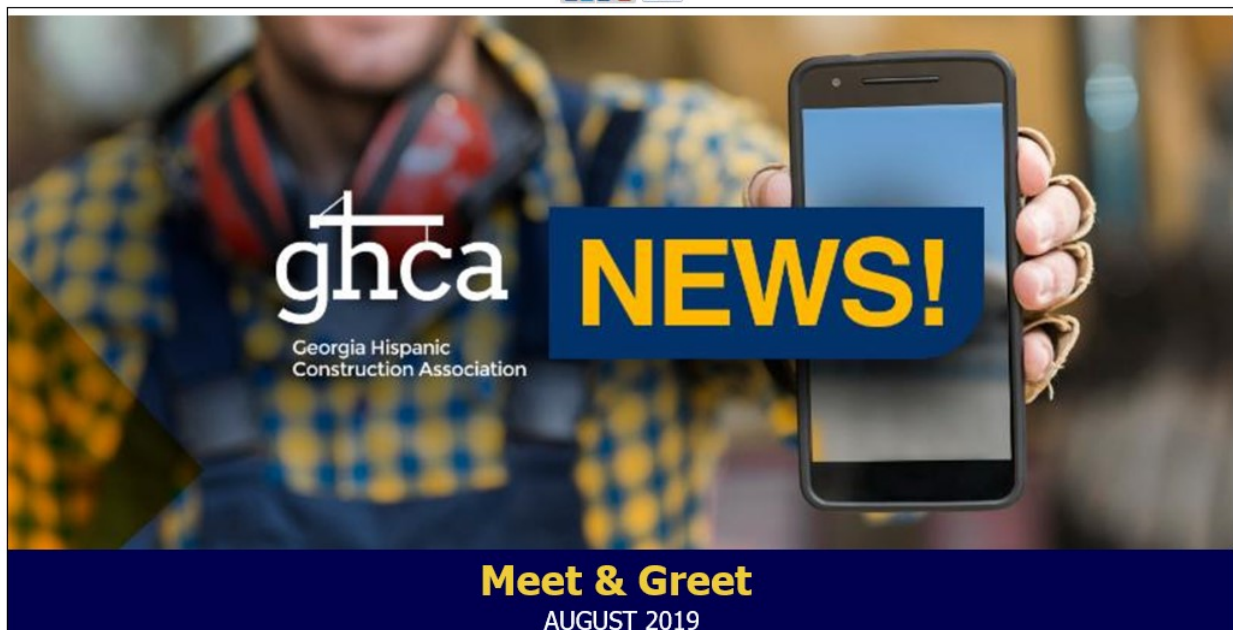

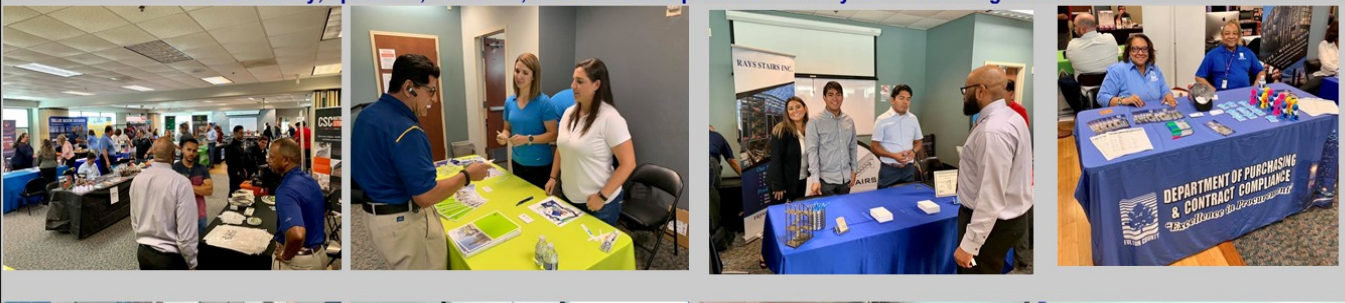

April is National Safe Digging Month! Most of us do not know what this is or why its important. So in efforts that we keep everyone safe, let us detail some important questions you might have regarding National Safe Digging Month.

What is Dig Safe?
Dig Safe, a nonprofit organization that will notify your utility company about your project for free. Then your utility company will help you plan a safe dig.

When Should I call 811?
The law requires that you call 811 any time you're going to perform an excavation. An excavation is simply movement or removal of earth, rock, or materials in the ground. In Massachusetts, the Dig Safe Law defines excavation very broadly and includes grading, backfilling, and demolition.

Creating a Re-purposed Garden

Raised beds are a great place to recycle

Raised-bed gardens are wonderful for many different reasons. Raised garden beds keep pathway weeds out of your garden, provide good drainage, prevent soil compaction and serve as a barrier to pests such as slugs and snails. The sides of the beds keep your valuable garden soil from eroding or being washed away during heavy rains. In many regions, gardeners are able to plant earlier and harvest later in the season because the soil is warmer when it is above ground level.

There are also great advantages for you, the gardener, as well. Raised beds allow you to tend your garden from the comfort of the garden path or a stool – no more bending over to pull weeds or trim plants. They tend to bring more order and a pleasing geometry to your garden.

There are numerous “ready-to-go” raised-bed gardens that can be purchased, but as my father is so fond of saying, “Why not use something indigenous to the area?” In other words, recycle what you already have in your yard.

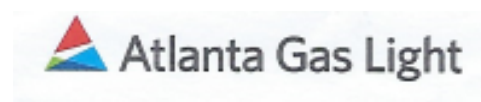

- **AVOID** using any sources of ignition, such as cell phones, cigarettes, matches, welders, flashlights, electronic devices or motorized vehicles, as natural gas can ignite from a spark or open flame, possibly causing a fire or explosion. Natural gas is non-toxic, lighter than air and displaces oxygen. In severe cases, if not used properly, natural gas can also lead to asphyxiation.
- **CALL 877.427.4321 and 911** once you are out of the area of the suspected leak and in a safe place. Stay away until Atlanta Gas Light or emergency personnel indicate it is safe to return.

Note: Be aware that some individuals may not be able to detect the odorant because they have a diminished sense of smell, olfactory fatigue or because the odor is being masked by other odors in the area. Certain conditions may cause the odorant to diminish so that it is not detectable. Some gas lines, due to their unique function, may not have odor at all.

Remember:

- **CALL** before you dig by dialing **811**
- **AWAIT** the required amount of time before digging
- **RESPECT** the marks

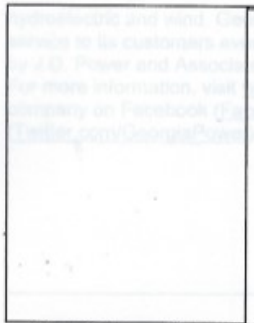

Efforts highlight importance of contacting 811 before you dig

ATLANTA - Aug. 9, 2019 - Georgia Power and Georgia 811 have teamed up once again to raise awareness for National 811 Day on August 11 ("8-11"). Employees at Georgia Power's Customer Care Center received a surprise visit today from Digger Dog, Georgia 811's mascot, to help them become more familiar with digging notification requirements. In addition, technicians from the company's underground location team demonstrated the tools and techniques used as they actually located and marked live underground lines onsite at Georgia Power's Customer Care Center.

"The safety of our employees and our communities is our top priority and having Georgia 811 and Digger Dog visit was a great reminder for our team of one way we can help our customers stay safe and prevent costly power outages from digging accidents," said Kevin Kastner, vice president of Customer Services. "This translates into our teammates being able to help customers understand the importance of contacting 811 to have underground power lines and other buried utilities marked before starting digging projects."

Georgia Power works every day with Georgia 811, a nonprofit corporation dedicated to preventing damage to underground utilities and promoting public safety, to ensure that projects are safe and comply with the "Georgia Dig Law." The law requires contact with Georgia 811 before mechanized digging to have buried power, communications, gas and water lines clearly marked, typically with flags, spray paint or both, to help prevent injuries, unintended service disruptions, repair costs and fines. In the first six months of 2019, Georgia Power has responded to approximately 440,000 requests for locating and marking of its underground power lines.

Georgia Power reminds customers of the importance of calling 811 or visiting Georgia811.com, to enter a location request at least two days before they dig. There is no charge for 811 location requests and contacting 811 is also recommended for smaller, manual jobs, such as planting trees, installing fences or mailboxes or other digging activity. Once the request is received, Georgia 811 notifies affected member utility companies, who send a professional technician to identify and mark underground lines.

A Public Safety Announcement (PSA), produced in partnership with Georgia 811, demonstrates how quick and easy it is to have underground lines identified. The PSA, available here for hi-resolution media download in 15- and 30-second versions, can also be viewed on Georgia Power's YouTube page.

Atlanta Gas Light Prepares for Hurricane Dorian

Staff Report From Metro Atlanta CEO

Tuesday, September 3rd, 2019

With safety of the public, its employees and its pipelines at the forefront, Atlanta Gas Light is closely monitoring the progress of Hurricane Dorian and how it may impact service operations and customers. Atlanta Gas Light is implementing its comprehensive emergency response plan and is advising customers to take the necessary precautions now to protect themselves and their families.

Meteorologists are predicting that Hurricane Dorian could cause substantial rain, damaging winds and the potential for flooding. Atlanta Gas Light is providing the following guidelines associated with natural gas safety before, during and immediately following the storm:

Appliance Safety

Customers are advised to leave their natural gas service operational during a hurricane or severe storm. Most modern gas appliances have safety valves that shut off the flow of natural gas automatically with a loss of gas pressure or flooding of the appliances.

Leaving appliances operational could prevent further damage of water getting into the customer's fuel line or appliance control valves.

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Electronic ignition appliances will not come on when the power source has been impacted.

Lowering the temperature on the central heat at the thermostat and turning the water heater to its lowest hot water setting is the best option.

If you are uncomfortable leaving your appliances operational, contact a trained professional (certified plumber or HVAC representative) to shut off your appliances at the cutoff valves. When it is safe to do so, have them return to turn the valves back on, leak test the line and turn on and test the appliance for safe operation.

If flooding occurs at a residence or business and the gas appliances are under water, customers are advised not to operate their appliances until a safety inspection is conducted by a certified plumber or HVAC representative.

Detecting Gas Leaks

If customers smell the distinctive rotten-egg odor associated with natural gas, they should leave the area immediately and move a safe distance away from the potential leak, while avoiding any action that may cause sparks.

Look for blowing dirt, discolored vegetation or continued bubbling in standing water.

Customers should never try to identify the source of a leak or stop the leak themselves.

Avoid using any sources of ignition, such as cell phones, cigarettes, matches, flashlights, electronic devices, motorized vehicles, light switches or landlines, as natural gas can ignite from a spark or open flame, possibly causing a fire or explosion.

Customers should call the Atlanta Gas Light 24-hour emergency response line at 1.877.427.4321 or 911 once they are in a safe place out of the area of the suspected leak. They should also stay away until Atlanta Gas Light or emergency personnel indicates it is safe to return.

Damage Prevention

Strong winds and saturated ground could cause trees to become uprooted. Before removing downed trees, customers should contact Georgia 811 by calling 811 to have the location of underground utility lines marked because downed trees could become tangled with the natural gas lines.

If a natural gas meter is damaged or natural gas line is exposed, customers should immediately leave the area and

If a natural gas meter is damaged or natural gas line is exposed, customers should immediately leave the area and call the Atlanta Gas Light 24-hour emergency response line at 1.877.427.4321 or 911 from a safe location.

Meter Safety

Customers are encouraged to know the location of their natural gas meter.

Following a weather emergency, customers should ensure the natural gas meter is visible, and the area surrounding the meter is free of trash and debris. Mechanical equipment used after the storm to clean up a location may damage the meter if it is hidden.

If a natural gas meter is damaged or an underground gas line is exposed, customers should immediately leave the area, and call the Atlanta Gas Light 24-hour emergency response line at 1-877-427-4321 or 911 from a safe location.

Natural Gas Generators

During a power outage, natural gas generators provide continuous fuel supply from an existing natural gas line. When these units are available in a range of sizes to meet various energy needs, customers are encouraged to contact Atlanta Gas Light prior to the installation to determine whether their service line and meter meets load requirements for the generator's safe and efficient operation.

Carbon Monoxide Safety

To ensure the safe, proper operation of natural gas appliances, such as a furnace and water heater, and to prevent the potentially hazardous buildup of carbon monoxide within your home or business, ensure that outdoor vent openings and air intakes are not obstructed.

If customers smell natural gas or suspect carbon monoxide is present in their home or business, they should immediately leave the area and call the Atlanta Gas Light 24-hour emergency response line at 1-877-427-4321 or 911 from a safe location.

Residents are encouraged to seek medical attention immediately if anyone in their home or business experiences possible symptoms of carbon monoxide.

Every day, natural gas is safely and efficiently delivered to millions of businesses and homes in the United States through more than 2 million miles of underground pipelines.

Pipeline operators adhere to federal, state and local pipeline safety regulations by performing quality control checks and educate the public on natural gas-leak recognition and damage prevention.

While these measures contribute to pipeline safety, and incidents are uncommon, the biggest threat to pipelines is excavation activity. It's important to educate yourself and your staff about natural gas safety and to always Call Before You Dig (811) to avoid creating an unsafe situation. Even a small pipeline leak can have severe consequences such as fire or explosion. Please do your part to ensure pipeline safety!

Remember

- **CONTACT** Georgia 811 before you dig by either dialing 811 or online at Georgia811.com.
